This evening begins the Pastors' Conference in Dallas, Texas, with the Annual Meeting of the Southern Baptist Convention beginning on Tuesday. As some of you may have heard, there is quite a bit of controversy this year on at least two fronts. The SBC has made national news because of some high profile leaders being fired or resigning as a result of the #metoo movement bringing to light sexual assault allegations against them. This has brought attention to the SBC's stance on women in leadership and will result in at least one major protest during the convention.

The other thing that is happening to draw attention is the vote for the next SBC President. One nominee represents the "old guard," while the other represents a younger demographic and change. Both of the nominees are great men of God, and both would serve well as president.
